WHY (WITH EXAMPLES)

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#### WHY? WHY SHOULD ONE ANY-WAY CONSIDER THE ARAMAIC LANGUAGE? THERE ARE SEVERAL REASONS FOR THAT (NOTE ESPECIALLY NUMBERS 4 AND 5) **REASONS:**

It is a holy language, where all names have a special meaning.

Jesus spoke aramaic.

Aramaic is the one and only language of God's word. All the scripture is in aramaic.

There is no exception. Even all chapters of the book of Daniel.

Aramaic was used in a very, very vast area.

Up to 500 km around JERUSALEM. Aramaic was spoken for a very, very long period. Far more than 300 years before, and far more than 300 years after Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

Examples A: understanding languages

Like, used in most languages: just saying hallo on the phone, or when passing by, turns out to mean: wishing each other holyness.

Like, in english, german, dutch: when -ed is added to an english root-word, it means:

it came to its fulfilment (like in english look-ed, and work-ed and so on.)

Also in german or dutch, when -t is added to a root-word. (like german geschaff-t and dutch gewerk-t)

Like, in english, french, spanish, etc: here is it so, that a starting a- with all words mean:

do it in an energetic way; like a-round, a-rise, a-rrange

a-gain, a-gree, a-scend, a-ware and so on. In french; a-jouter; a-ppointer.

ly, as a starting 'a' is ad

Like, in german and dutch: when ge- is placed before a root-word, it means:

in a bordering way

Like german ge- schaft, and dutch ge- werkt)

Like, in english, german, dutch: There is a parculiar thing about the number 8: two circles:

representing a fence.

While 8 is obviously related to w-ait (w-eight) and in german (be-acht: be-ob-acht)

and dutch (w-acht). And also that eight in english resembles the french huit.

8 Aramaic has all to do with numbers.

#### THE NUMBER SEVEN: Example 1:

In aramaic is seven: sheba ( jbS ). But in the same time it means: saturate.

the time between pesach and shebaoth: is 7 times 7:is very very complete.

forgiving 7 times 7, means: forgive in a more than satisfying way.

also anything to do with: the SHABBATH.

and also anything to do with JESUS, being the LORD OF THE SHABBATH.

## THE NUMBER NINE:

Nine in aramaic is jST, and a-jST means the manifestation of nine; to tell. ( PARCULIAR!)

While the table of 9 itself is also wondrous; for in a row the outcome is: 09,18,27,36,45 and than reversing 54,63,72,81,90. So this has a mirror effect.

Also is the sum of the digits of each result, every time 9.The latter is true for any multiplication by 9 . Example: 127 \* 9 = 1143= 1+1+4+3= 9.

This is not the case with other numbers. Which have their own specifics (like multiplying by 19 gives consecutive climbing rows, for the sums of end-results) So the sum of the digits of the result of any multiplication by 9 is 9. ( ALSO PARCULIAR!)

## So: In fact gives the language information about the numbers! (Seven hints us about: saturation, and nine about telling.)

So God's word is very very important.






